2018-04-21 Cabot Head and Bruce Peninsula (2-day trip)

The Bruce Peninsula between Georgian Bay and Lake Huron is a corridor for migrating birds. Over the weekend we will visit two separate areas on the Bruce: Saturday's birding will concentrate on the Cabot Head area with concentrations of Red-necked Grebes and other waterbirds on Georgian Bay and hawks moving along the cliffs of the Niagara Escarpment. Sunday's birding will focus on the Lake Huron shoreline with special emphasis on Black Creek Prov. Park Reserve, Stokes Bay, Isaac & Sky Lakes and the Oliphant shoreline. The meeting point both days is in the parking area for the Spirit Rock Outpost and Lodge on Highway #6 at the north end of Wiarton at 8:30 a.m. Accommodation is available at Spirit Rock. Bring a packed lunch.
