The January Petroglyphs trip co-hosted by the Peterborough Field Naturalists was most successful, with over 40 attendees. While the weather was most unco-operative, the birding was generally good. While few birds were seen by everyone, everyone saw something. The list included Barrow's Golden-eye, Bald Eagle (2), Golden Eagle (1), Gray Jay, Raven, White-winged Crossbill and Red-shouldered Hawk.

CALLS FOR INFORMATION/UPCOMING EVENTS/NEW PUBLICATIONS:

(1) The ROM advises that an exciting new bird display will be opening on the 7th of April at the museum Representing all of the 25 orders of the world's birds, over 400 individual specimens are shown.

Special display cases allow visitors to walk underneath, alongside or through this dramatic assemblage of birds. "Drawer" displays allow visitors to delve deeper into the lives of birds by opening these labled drawers. Other parts of the display concentrate on flight through mounted specimens and audio-visual aids, and endangered species, present, past and future. Additions to the display will be opened in December 1990. Elsewhere in the museum, concerned individuals may want to take in the rain forest display.

NOTE: As part of a new feature dealing with Reader Services where we will continue to provide you with up to date information on new publications and information, we should like to advise of the availability of the following two publications:

- (2) The Canadian Wildlife Service has just published a two-volume set of the "Atlas of Nearctic Shorebirds on the Coast of South America" by Dr. R. Morrison and Dr. R. Ross. This is available free from CWS, National Wildlife Research Centre, 100 Gamelin Blvd., Hull, Quebec, K1A OH3. While it is not designed for the incidental birder, anyone with a strong interest in shorebirds or South America would be well advised to order a copy.
- (3) "The New Approach to Identification" by Peter Grant offers field identification tips in one thin volume. There are chapters on wing structure, moult sequences, and difficult groups such as shorebirds. It is available from OFO Reader Services through our regular mailing address listed on the masthead. The cost is \$10.00 plus \$1.00 shipping and handling.
- (4) The annual conference of the Federation of Ontario Naturalists will be held in Thunder Bay on June 1-3/90. There is much to interest keen birders. Some of the planned activities include: visiting nesting locales for Black Terns, Red-necked Grebes, White Pelicans and Yellow-headed Blackbirds; birding with local experts; awards ceremony for the annual Photo Salon; listening to speakers such as Robert Taylor on the Great Gray Owl and Dan Welsh on songbirds and logging; cruising Nipigon Bay to visit off-shore islands and attending numerous other field trips.
